

How to realize more turnover in foreign markets with DHI-subsidy

Would you like to increase your export in 2018? The Dutch government provides financial support to Dutch SME's to develop their business activities in foreign markets. DHI is open for all countries except for the Netherlands and sanctioned countries. DGGF countries are extra eligible for funding*. Applications can be submitted from 1st of February 2018 onwards. Read below which activities are eligible.

1. Demonstration project

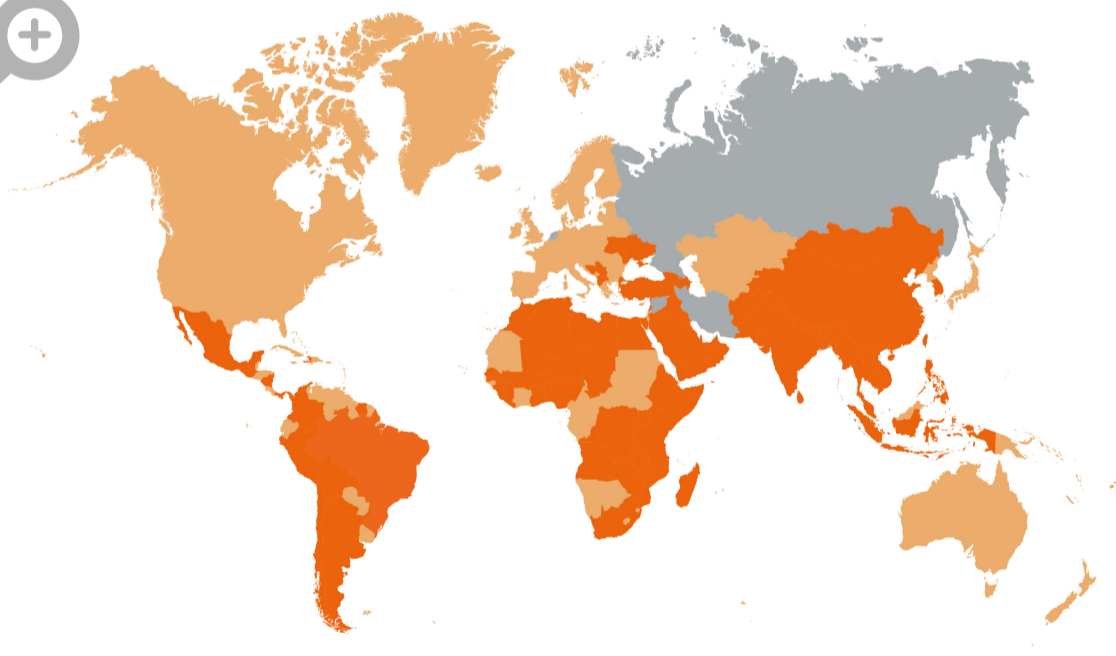
- Demonstrate your Dutch technology to potential clients with the aim to convince them about your product.
- The subsidy amounts to 50% of the eligible costs up to max. € 200,000.

2. Feasibility study

- Convince your potential client, by means of executing a study that shows the technical and commercial feasibility of your product.
- The subsidy amounts to 50% of the eligible costs up to max. € 100,000.

3. Pre-investment study

- Assess the technical and commercial feasibility of your investment opportunity abroad.
- The subsidy amounts to 50% of the eligible costs up to max. € 100,000.
